Stirling and Starling appear to be popular first names in the LINDSEY family in the 1800s; could be from ancestor, Sir John DeStirling of the 1300?)

Melissa Lindsey moved with her parents, Carlton and Mary Lindsey, from S.C., to Kentucky, then, with her husband William Coalson, her mother and other Coalsons and Lindseys, to Hinds Co., Miss, in about 1830, between the firsts of Allen Powell Coalson, 1829, and Vines Lindsey Coalson, 1833.

Melissa Lindsey Coalson named her second Allen Powell Coalson, probably for the husband of Phanny Lindsey Powell, who was Allen Powell.
